Under this agreement for 2019 Roadvale State School will receive

\$12,304*

This funding will be used to

- Guarantee that every student will either:
 - achieve National Minimum Standards in Literacy for their year level or
 - have an evidence based learning plan in place to address their specific learning needs.
- Maintain Year 3 students meeting NMS in Reading at 97% for 2019.
- Achieve 33% of Year 3 students in the U2B in Reading and Numeracy for 2019.
- Develop a learning plan for every student currently below NMS in literacy.
- Improve teacher and teacher aide capability through focused professional development to improve student performance.

Our initiatives include


- Review student data on a 5 week cycle focused on comprehension. Using the Literacy Continuum to monitor students progress.
- Provide feedback to students and set individual goals {Visible Learning for Teachers – Hattie}.
- Build teacher capability in explicit teaching through regular coaching, feedback and mentoring.
- Introduce Age Appropriate pedagogies.
- Explicit teaching of Reading Skills - inferring, text dependent questions.
- Continue 'Robust Vocabulary Intervention' in Literacy Block.
- Continue Phonemic Awareness Program in Prep – 2.
- Timetabling and support of Literacy Blocks in Whole School.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Developing an ongoing cycle of data collection and monitoring individual student progress – Early Start, Literacy Continuum.
- Embedding a Whole School Approach to Reading.
- Employing a part time teacher aide to work with students during Literacy Block. **\$10 809**
- Purchasing a teacher to cover class enabling teachers to observe peers as well as receive coaching, feedback and mentoring. 2 hours, 2 days per term. **\$1 495**
